Martin County Historical Museum

Located at 207 East Broadway in Stanton, Texas, Martin County Historical Museum offers several resources to benefit the researcher of regional history.

The museum has an established archives with written works on the oil industry and on most West Texas counties and other areas of interest. The archives holds more than one hundred oral histories, partially transcribed, that feature the many war veterans of the area. The archives has bound volumes of *Stanton Reporter* newspapers dating from the 1930s.

Location of Fall 1990 Meeting Place

The Center for Energy and Economic Diversification is located on the southeastern corner of the intersection of Farm Road 1788 and U. S. Highway 191 a few miles north of Midland International Airport in Midland County, Texas. Coming into Midland County on Interstate 20, one can exit onto Farm Road 1788 at the airport and travel north to the CEED Building, which has a pond with a fountain at its front. U. S. Highway 191 connects Midland and Odessa, giving easy access to attendees from either city. There is plenty of free parking at the CEED Building.
