Permian Historical Society To Honor Pioneer Educators at Spring Meeting

The society will recognize three Permian Basin educators who have contributed to the cultural, civic, religious, and academic enrichment of the area for over fifty years.

Permian Historical Society will honor Marjorie Rogers Morris, Edith Irene McNerlin Springer, and Grover Marlin Springer with its Permian Pioneer Award on 21 May 1994 at the Energy Center. All three honorees have worked for the cultural, civic, and religious advancement of the area. Each experienced a long and dedicated career in education.

Marjorie Rogers Morris taught English at Odessa High School and at Odessa College, where she was named a Piper Professor. She is widely known as the founder of the Globe of the Great Southwest, a reconstruction of the Shakespearean Globe Theatre.

Edith Irene McNerlin Springer taught twenty-six years in the country schools of Valley View, Tarzan, and Lenorah and in Grady School District, all in Martin County. At the Grady School she and her husband, Grover, sponsored the Junior Historians, encouraging students to research and write local history.

Grover Marlin Springer also taught in the Martin County schools with his wife, Irene, and was principal at the Tarzan, Lenorah, and Grady schools. He organized Scout Troop 10 in 1937 and served as scoutmaster for more than forty years, receiving the Silver Beaver award for leadership. With Irene, he worked on a history of Martin County sponsored by the county historical society.

The Energy Center is located at the intersection of Farm Road 1788 and State Highway 191 in northwestern Midland County. The meeting begins at 9:30 A. M. with registration, coffee, and a board meeting.
