P. H. S. to Present Its Highest Award

Permian Historical Society is proud to present its highest award, the Permian Academy of History, to two outstanding West Texans at its spring meeting in Odessa on 15 May 1993.

Elmer Kelton is author of more than thirty novels, published over almost forty years. His latest works are *Slaughter*, *Honor At Daybreak*, *The Man Who Rode Midnight*, *Dark Thicket*, and *Stand Proud*. He has written three novels in the *Sons of Texas* under the pseudonym Tom Early. The novelist is a four-time winner of the Spur Award from Western Writers of America and the 1990 recipient of the Distinguished Achievement Award from the Western Literature Association.

Joe Pickle began his service to the area at the *Big Spring Herald* in 1931. As a reporter for the paper, he interviewed many area pioneers. He later became editor of the paper and authored numerous newspaper and magazine articles on Permian Basin people and their history. He retired from the newspaper in 1975 after forty-four years and began writing a history of the area. The result is his book *Gettin' Started: Howard County's First Twenty-Five Years*.
